Nursery and Reception had a fabulous time at Park Hall Farm in Oswestry. They especially loved the pig races and there were lots of tired children on the coach home!




















Attendance

This year to date our whole school attendance is 92.2%. As you know, we aim for over 96%. We have had lots of children with childhood illnesses but please remember that once they are feeling well enough we are happy to administer medicine in school (Once relevant forms have been completed). Whilst we understand and sympathise that with the cost of living at the moment, taking holidays during term time can be a lot cheaper, we cannot authorise requests and these will be registered as 'Unauthorised absences'. This is in line with the advice of Chester West LA Attendance managers. Thank you for your understanding.

If a child's attendance falls below a certain level, our attendance team will invite parents to school for an attendance panel meeting. These are not intended to blame or judge but rather an opportunity to offer support, if needed, or allow you to talk about your child's absence with a view to working together. If you receive a letter, please don't worry, just come in and have a chat with us. We also have had an increase in unauthorised attendance. All schools have to report unauthorised absence to the Local Authority and you may be issued an

Education Penalty Notice (EPN). Thank you for your cooperation with this.








Uniform
