Staying safe over Christmas



There have been a number of children informing staff that they have been enjoying sleep overs or regularly going to other children's households. Please ensure you keep your child, yourselves and the school staff as safe as possible, following guidance stringently and not mixing beyond your own bubbles.

Please continue to follow all government guidance in order to stay safe. The following guidance below explains what to do in the event that your child develops Covid-19 symptoms in the run up to or over the festive period.

Christmas Test and Trace Arrangements-Public Health guidance

Parents should continue to notify the school if their child develops symptoms of COVID-19 or is asymptomatically tested (tested when they don't have symptoms) in the final week before the Christmas break.

Notifying the school of a positive test result

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 and has been tested or was asymptomatically tested (tested when they don't have symptoms) and the results do not arrive before the school closes for Christmas, please email:

Notifying the school if your child develops COVID-19 symptoms after the school closes for Christmas on Friday 18th December

Notify the school if:

- Your child develops symptoms or is asymptomatically tested (tested when they don't have symptoms) before 2:00pm on 20 December 2020 and;
- Your child was in school in the 48hrs prior to the symptom on-set (or test if they have been tested but don't have symptoms).

You do not need to notify the school if:

- Your child has not been in school in the 48hrs prior to the symptom on-set (or test if they have been tested but don't have symptoms).
- Your child develops symptoms or is asymptomatically tested (tested when they don't have symptoms) after 2:00pm on Sunday 20 December 2020.

Testing

We would like to remind parents that children should only be tested if they develop any of the three COVID-19 symptoms:

- **a high temperature** this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature).
- **a new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

 this means you've noticed you cannot smell or
 taste anything, or things smell or taste different to
 normal.

They should not be tested asymptomatically (when they don't have symptoms) unless they are part of a study or have been advised to do so by a Consultant in Public Health.



Returning to school in January 2021

The school does not need to be notified if your child is required to self-isolate during the Christmas holidays. However, if your child is required to isolate and will not be in school on the 5th January 2021 when the children return, please contact the school on 4th January 2021 (staff INSET day) outlining the reason why they are isolating and the date they will return. We will then update our attendance records and look to support you with home learning.

Test and trace arrangements when the school re-opens in January

From school reopening for pupils on the 5th January 2021 onwards, the normal test and trace procedures will apply, and parents should contact the school to notify us if their child develops symptoms of COVID-19.

Advent

All families should have received an angel to put in your windows at home and the children will also shortly receive a 'make your own' crib to do at home with a short reflection. Miss Reid and Mrs Brickland have been working exceptionally hard with the children to create short videos for parents of the children performing.
