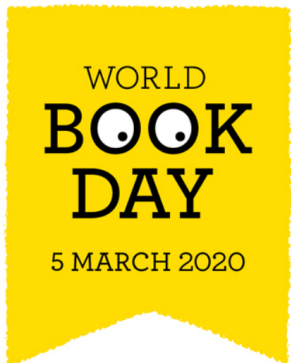




St B'S Reading Newsletter

Thursdays

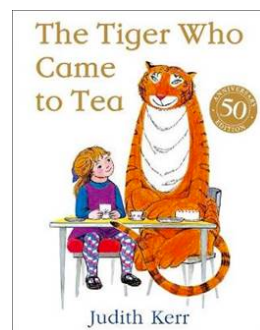
Under 5s storytime

2pm - 2.30pm, weekly. Pop in to join us for some stories.

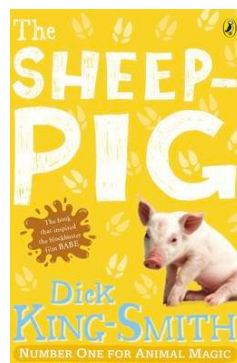

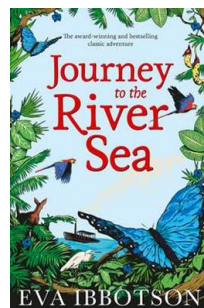
