

Last week all the children in the school celebrated their learning when we held an exhibition. We invited parents/carers to the event to see their work around social justice. In 2018, the school co-created a play called Adrift with Action Transport Theatre.

With this play as a catalyst, the school designed a whole school project around the plight of refugees. Children learn about reasons for migration and through beautiful texts such as Wisp: A Story of Hope and The Day the War Came, are able to explore the effects of displacement on refugees. The work is also closely linked to the UN Rights of a Child.
