

Over 30 of our children have missed over 10% of their schooling this term. This has huge impact on their education and well-being. We are continuing to work with families to improve this and support in any way we can.

Social Media

Over the past term we have had an increasing amount of issues rising from the use of social media. These issues, which occur outside school hours, can spill into school. Some children are accessing their phones throughout the night and messaging other children inappropriately - often via Snapchat. Snapchat is a platform that has an age rating of 13+. As a school we need your support, as a parent, to monitor your child's phone and limit their usage. It is very difficult to manage this as a school, if parents do not check their child's phone periodically or allow their child to have access to their phone through the night. Safeguarding is our first priority at St Bernard's.







Water/Ice Safety

I am sure you have all seen the devastating news this week about the 3 young children who lost their lives whilst out playing in the snow and ice. We have told the children to follow these guidelines:

- Always tell an adult where you are going
- Always stay together
- Never venture out onto any frozen water as it may not be very strong
- If a friend gets into difficulty, throw something to them, don't try and rescue them
- Call 999 and ask for the fire service phones need to be charged and the call is free
- If you fall into water, lie on your back and try and float by making a star shape.
