<u>Tree Dressing Workshop</u>




We had a wonderful time dressing the trees in our woodland area. We decorated some tree trunks, created hanging decorations with ribbon hoops and some from recycled tin cans.

ATTENDANCE

This year to date our whole school attendance is 94.4%. As you know, we aim for over 96%. We have had lots of children with childhood illnesses but please remember that once they are feeling well enough we are happy to administer medicine in school (Once relevant forms have been completed).

Whilst we do understand and sympathise that with the cost of living at the moment, taking holidays during term time can be a lot cheaper, we cannot authorise requests and these will be registered as 'Unauthorised absences'. This is in line with the advice of Chester and Cheshire West LA Attendance managers. Thank you for your understanding.

If a child's attendance falls below a certain level, our attendance team will invite parents into school for an attendance panel meeting. These are not intended to blame or judge but rather an opportunity to offer support, if needed, or give you the opportunity to talk about your child's absence with a view to working together. If you receive a letter, please don't worry, just come in and have a chat with us.



We also have had an increase in unauthorised attendance. All schools have to report unauthorised absence to the Local Authority and you may be issued with an Education Penalty Notice (EPN). Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Uniform

Post COVID we have noticed that more children are not adhering to our school uniform. Children can come into school on PE days dressed in their PE kit:

This consists of navy shorts, plain white t-shirt and black pumps/trainers. In winter months jogging bottoms or leggings can be worn for PE lessons outside.

Please note that jewellery, including earrings, should not be worn and children will be asked to remove such items. Pumps/trainers should only be worn on PE days. Thank you for supporting us with this.
